Please describe a summary of work undertaken by the SAC to improve student achievement and school performance.

This year, the SAC allocated funds to each classroom teacher and specialist teacher to purchase items for their classrooms. Specifically, teachers would use these funds for classroom materials to support tier 1 behavioral supports and reward-based systems.

We routinely had conversations as an SAC around student achievement. Specifically, conversations focussed on the P-2 literacy priority work, and subsequent achievement of our students. We also had conversations throughout the year regarding the math professional development, focussed on the grades 4 to 6 fact fluency work.

As an SAC, we decided to allocate money to secure substitute teachers, to support staff collaborative time during the instructional day. We committed funds that would allow us to secure several subs on a day for teachers to meet with school administration to discuss their students. We decided that we would do this on more than one occasion throughout the year.

Unfortunately, due to a systemwide shortage of Substitute teacher 's, we were unable to fulfill this commitment throughout the school year.

As an SAC we reviewed the results of the student well-being survey that was conducted in the spring of 2022. This conversation around student well-being led to conversations about how we can best support classroom teachers and students to build upon the relational component of developing a safe and healthy school community.
